

Developing pincer grips and power grips. Printing with vehicles (links to jobs) Pegs and washing lines. Cotton wool and dabbers



Literacy

Traditional Tales Continue to look after books Provide areas for books to live Create a love for reading environment Exploring books before reading - What can you see? Does it have words? Let's read the blurb.

We will listen carefully to rhymes, stories, non-fiction and poems and attempt to join in with repeated refrains.

We are following the Letters and Sounds Phonics programme. This term we will cover body percussion, rhythm and rhyme.

Name recognition and name building.

Children will explore mark making in a variety of forms; whiteboards, blackboards, easels, rolls of paper, Ipads, interactive touch pads, sensory trays, paint.
